ancaster City is often culturally linked to Lancaster County, which is well known for its Amish heritage. While the city embraces Pennsylvania Dutch tradition, it also offers a thriving contemporary arts community and a growing downtown center. Conducting board meetings, brainstorming sessions, company retreats and other business functions outside the office are common ways to encourage creative thinking, and the Lancaster Arts Hotel has the innovative business space to fit the bill. With a meeting room right in its art gallery, just think of the possibilities.

"This is not your typical, boxy board room," said Sultan. "The art changes every few months so it's a different experience every time."

The art gallery board room can accommodate up to 20 people. Larger meetings and events can be held in the late afternoon or evening, or be


coordinated in partnership with various unique clubs and surrounding venues that complement the hotel.
